


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Encouragement from S.A.M.



We continue to address the concerns those in their First Year of Torah observance likely will have. The subject today is the need to re-assess faith in light of what has been newly understood. This will probably continue over several issues. Batya Wootten responded to our last newsletter with words of encouragement for those who may still struggle with the issue that was first in importance among our survey responders: their personal feelings of anger, sadness and regret. She says: *I think it helps us deal with the idea of not having been taught the truth when we see that the non-Jewish Believers (Ephraim) are part of the people of Israel, and that they too were blinded; they too have stumbled over the Sanctuary that is Messiah Yeshua (Gen 48:19; Isa 8:13-14; John 2:19-22; Rom 11:25; Eph 2:11-22). If we can understand that they too were hardened, it helps us to be able to forgive and to have mercy on them, even as we have mercy on the Jewish people who do not yet see the Divine Messiah. 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Reassessing our Faith

As we come into an understanding of our Hebraic Heritage it becomes evident along the line that some of the things we had previously understood now need to be re-examined and considered in the new light. It seems to be this very need that can shake some people so deeply that they turn back.

May it not be so! Our faith and belief in Messiah Yahshua's birth, death and resurrection will not be shaken as we get better acquainted with Him. We appreciated Lew White's analogy in the introduction of his book [Fossilized Customs](#) Lew's observations:

TRUTH AND LIES: Let's imagine you are 1000 feet in the air, standing on the high steel framework of a new skyscraper under construction. You are supported by each of the steel girders below you, and the massive concrete foundation resting on the bedrock of the Earth. Your primary interest at this point is your safety. The girders below must each be riveted well to one another, because if even ONE is just jammed in with no rivets, the whole structure

I want to remind you that this article is a work in progress as we seek *YHWH's* direction. Also, remember as we have talked about maturity in our lives, it doesn't signify our value as a child of the King. Neither is it to imply that where we happen to be along the way is the full expression He is calling us into. *YHWH* is always working in our lives to stretch and refine us until *Yahshua* comes again. So, take an honest look at your prayer life. Is *YHWH* trying to teach you something? Has your prayer life been lacking? Has your relationship with *Abba* been as intimate as you'd like it to be? We were actually pleasantly surprised when we realized that the levels of maturity in prayer life also fit well with the model provided by Shepherds House. This seems to us another

could fall at any moment! Any girder with no rivets is like a lie, because you put your trust in it as if it were the truth. The only way to know if each girder is "true" is to closely examine each one. To appear to be a part of the structure is not enough in itself, because you place your trust in every girder below you believing that they are "true". end quote

Every thing we have been taught over the years goes into the establishment of our faith and confidence in Messiah's work on our behalf. Now, we see where some of these things have been called into question. Rather than hang back, we urge people to confess their fear to Him and then to go on with the process. He will not fail you! His Word and Promises are true. Some of our expressions of faith may fall, but not the Person of our faith relationship!

This personal reassessment of faith is one part of the process that occurs. In my re-evaluation I also did research into the history of the church, starting with my Lutheran background and moving back to the early church Fathers. It also included an assessment of what pagan and sun worship expressions of faith looked like. It is the preponderance of information in each of these areas that brought my intellectual understanding up to speed, if you will, with what the *Ruach*/Spirit was telling my heart.

We will continue next time with more information on what this reassessment can involve. Your thoughts are always welcome along the way.

confirmation of what He is doing in His people.

The Life Model defines five levels of maturity based on a number of studies and Scriptural support. Physical aging doesn't guarantee maturity. The five different maturity levels in the *Life Model* are: *the Infant Stage, the Child Stage, the Adult Stage, the Parent Stage and the Elder Stage*. The look or sound of our prayer life is influenced by our maturity level. Here are our **initial** thoughts about each of these stages. What do you think about maturity in prayer? Where do you see yourself? What do you remember about being a new believer? What differences might it make in your prayer life if it closely matches the maturity of your faith?

1. The New Believer.

Prayers tend to be "me" centered, probably joyful and excited. Aware of the blessings *Yahshua* has given them. Prayers are generally focused on asking for blessings for their own decisions--"help me to...." kind of prayers. The New Believer is usually unaware of "the cost" and expectations of coming into the Kingdom. May perceive God as brother or friend most

p.m. CST. This class is based on the principles of the *Life Model: Living from the Heart Jesus Gave You* by *The Shepherd's House*.

Because of struggles or abuse throughout life, people may have gaps in their maturing process that interfere with their productivity and relationships. This isn't their fault and the good news is--they're not stuck either!

Do you find yourself just "blowing up" for no reason, find it hard to confront people or to "fit in" groups? Do you have constant struggles in your relationships or have you ever heard "Awww, just GROW UP!?" This group may have some answers for you.

2. Becoming More Serious about Faith. Beginning to be aware that there are expectations for being in the Kingdom, including discipline and "pruning". Struggling to be humble yet still expecting one's own expectations to be met. Often easily discouraged. Unbelief and doubt quickly come in. May perceive Father and Son as Lord and a beginning awareness of the Spirit working in their life.

3. Becoming a Servant of YHWH. Developing an awareness of the goals of humility, that one's own expectations may not be the goal. Occasionally able to trust without understanding. Beginning to understand that it is God's plan that is important, not one's own ideas. May still be easily discouraged at times. Beginning to perceive Father, Son and Spirit as King and Lord but perhaps in a more abstract sense.

4. Becoming a Bond Servant of YHWH. Most often aware of *Elohim's* plan as of paramount importance. Increasing sense of intimacy with Him. Most often able to release one's own expectations in favor of whatever unknown plan God has without daily
