# U.S. Corrections Picture Today

- ➤ Over **6.5 million people** under correctional supervision (3.2 million in 1990)
- > Over 2.4 million people incarcerated (774,000 in 1990)
- Federal prisons operating at 131% of capacity
- 1,558 state prisons, 84 federal facilities and
   26 privately operated facilities in US

# U.S. Corrections Picture Today

- > 93% **Male** (increased 77% since 1990)
- > 7% Female (increased 108% since 1990)
- > 46% African-American
- > 38% White
- > 70% Can't Read above a 5<sup>th</sup> grade level
- ➤ More than 50% are **Drug Offenders**
- > 95% of men had no loving Male Role Model

# WI Corrections Picture Today

#### **AS OF July 18, 2008**

- ➤ DOC Budget for Corrections over \$2 Billion
- Prisons operating at about 120% capacity
- > 71,425 on Probation or Parole
- 22,797 Men & Women incarcerated
   21,400 Male 1,397 Female
- > 599 Juveniles incarcerated
- ➤ 204 Juveniles in Aftercare or Corrective Sanctions

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## **The Issues That We Face**

- Crime impacts one of three families in the United States each year.
- Today, more than 2.4 million adults are in jail or prison - millions more on probation or parole.
- It costs \$60-75,000 per inmate to build new cells, and \$24,000 per inmate each year to maintain.
- The total U.S. cost is over \$34 BILLION annually.
- Countless Millions of \$\$\$ are spent at city and county levels for police and jail systems.

 The problem affects big cities and small; with jails estimated at 97% of capacity, nationally.

 Juvenile crime is growing at a faster rate than adult crime -- which ensures that the problem WILL persist.

 Imprisonment is growing at an annual rate of nearly five percent nationally.


# **Statistics**

- 887,000+ prisoners released in the coming year in the United States – 2,430 per day!
- Within 2 years the "majority" go back to prison
- Over 2 million children with at least one parent in prison – many have both!
- Prison is a way of life for many

# Recidivism & Overcrowding

- Almost 80% of crimes are committed by <u>Repeat</u> offenders. (They are <u>NOT</u> being rehabilitated!)
- 95% of prisoners will be released within 3 years
- Most will return to society ill-equipped to enter trades or professions; or hold a productive job
- Most will not have learned to deal with problems of loneliness, mistrust, and hatred

#### WORLDWIDE PRISON POPULATIONS




Prison rates in the US are the world's highest, at 724 per 100,000 people.

In Russia the rate is 581 per 100,000 people.




# 2002 Prison Admissions by County of Commitment







#### Black men in prison

Every year, 7,000 to 8,000 ex-offenders return to the community from prison. Many return to crime because they can't get a job. A disproportionate number of people in Department of Corrections facilities are African-American men, the majority of whom settle in the Milwaukee area after making their way back from prison.

# Traditional solutions **HAVE** failed

that have been proven effective are those which seek to help change ...




the **HEARTS** of criminals
