FOREWORD

Thank you for your interest in Set Apart Ministries!

There is a lot of information about who we are and what we do on our website but we thought it might also be helpful to provide much of that information in written form. Everyone does not have internet access! This little booklet contains much about us, including our statement of faith, our goals, and brief descriptions of many things that are important to us as a community.

Sometimes it is just easier to have printed information at your fingertips, though we expect this booklet to be used as a resource, and not something that would be read straight through!

We are a community that values and pursues both knowledge of the Word and the development of maturity, which includes character development and resolution from trauma. We teach and live both Papa's and Mama's Torah (Proverbs 1:8-9) We are a Messiah Centered, Torah Pursuant, Relational Maturity Community. We are a Zadok ministry and treat the development of personal and corporate faith seriously.

We are now much better equipped as a community to answer questions that come up than we were even just a few years ago, but we thought this booklet might still be of help. We have begun to assign a long term member for a personal support/mentor/shepherd for each newer person when that seems to be needed.

Our **Study Guide** is included here for those new to Hebraic understanding and/or those who'd like to pursue status as a *Bar/Bat Mitzvah* (Son or Daughter of the Commandments) with SAM. This material has been reviewed and vetted by Barbara L. Klika, MSW/Undershepherd and Janell I. Schroeder, B.B.A./Teaching Elder as well founded, valid material that will help in the process of re-assessing the foundation of faith for one coming from traditional Christian background as well as establishing that foundation for one coming of age.

It is not and has never been a requirement for participation in SAM, though it is recommended as a way of establishing a common ground of understanding.

Putting it here in printed form may make it more accessible for everyone to use, whether they are in the process of transition and re evaluating their doctrinal understandings or if they want to pursue becoming a recognized Son or Daughter of the Commandments, in our equipping ministry assembly.

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Statement of Faith:

We believe in the God of Israel, YHWH, Who is eternally existent and Who made the heavens and the earth, and all that is in them.

We believe in His Son, our Messiah, Yeshua/ also known as Jesus of Nazareth, fully God and fully man. He was born of a virgin, lived a sinless life, was crucified, died and was buried. He rose again on the third day and is coming again soon as a Conquering King, to bring in the millennial reign.

We believe in the Eternal Existence of the *Ruach haKodesh*/the Holy Spirit indwelling in the hearts of those who have believed, made confession of sin, repented, and received *Yeshua*.

We affirm that the commandments of YHWH/God to observe His holy days (*moedim*) and His ways in all things remain the same as in the beginning. Belief in *Yeshua* and the coming of the *Ruach haKodesh*/Holy Spirit has resulted in these same commandments being written upon our hearts.

We affirm that through Messiah's work on our behalf, we have salvation and have been freed from the bondage of sin and death to choose obedience to walk after Him in His ways, which is the sanctification process.

We affirm the Scriptures are inherently infallible in the original languages and confirm the need for both Papa's Torah (knowledge of the Word) and Mama's Torah (character development, maturity.)

We affirm that God created both men and women in His image and that taken together, they are the most complete physical representation of the character of YHWH/God.

We affirm that the Scriptures define both individual and corporate righteousness as we enter into the sanctification process to become more like Messiah, living in His full presence for eternity.

Community Definition:

A multi-generational group of interdependent, like-minded people with a clear, stable identity based in YHWH, mutually defined and articulated as in a growing organism, with structure, authority, and boundaries; generally based in recognition of attained maturity, and the shared goal of set-apart living in daily interaction;

an interdependent network of covenant relationships based in Echad with Messiah Yeshua.

Our Model of 4 Levels of Fellowship Groups Defined:

1-Occassional Gatherings

2-Regular Gatherings

3-Developing Covenant Relationship Gatherings

4-Covenant Relationships in Daily Interaction -- sometimes called an Intentional Community.

We see that a group in each "stage" will have different needs and expectations of both members and leaders.

Level 1

These are people who gather occasionally to study Torah, pray and/or worship and enjoy one another's company. There is no specific commitment other than choosing to attend. There is no group identity or specific leadership.

Level 2

These are people who are committed to regular study, prayer, worship and fellowship together, perhaps meeting even several times a week. There is no group identity or specific leadership although there may be influential people who work together to coordinate gatherings.

Level 3

These are people who have chosen to interact together on a regular basis, in a Torah based lifestyle, with intended long-term relationship; in short, covenant relationships.

Level 4

People in covenant relationships who choose to live in a neighborhood setting of some kind; often called an intentional community by secular organizations.
Occasional group meetings do not constitute a community in our understanding.
For occasional groups, there is a social connection with a sense of shared values but this is not formally established or agreed upon.

This is a group of independent individuals, but not necessarily inter-dependent relationships.

A group that has undefined, fluid leadership roles is not the same thing as an organism such as the Body of Messiah.

A group that forms around a gifted teacher may have an identity based on that teacher but not an agreed upon group identity that would stand whether or not that teacher remained.

Such a gifted teacher may or may not have the leadership or shepherding skills that are essential to our understanding of community.

Perhaps most importantly:

Casual or social groups will not experience the same kind of sanctification struggles with opportunity for growth that is found in a community with clear commitment to one another.

People often find it easier to walk away than to mutually resolve differences.

It is hard to understand that "struggle" can be good!

We further believe that the process of sanctification is nearly impossible in the earlier stages and will most fully occur in those groups that move toward the greater level of commitment of stages 3 and 4.

It is also to be expected that fears and anxieties will rise as a group moves toward greater levels of intimacy and commitment; so it is helpful to consider what level a group is in when considering a group to join.

We do not see these levels as automatically progressive from one to four, although they may be.

Our local community seems to be between Levels 3 and 4, with intentions of moving more firmly into 4.

Tools for Personal Growth and Discipleship

Our primary personal growth tool is the material associated with Life Model: Living from the Heart Jesus Gave You, and is dealt with in regular meetings for both Ladies and Men's Life Model groups, not primarily on Shabbat where our focus is on Messiah. Participation in this process has never been required but it is strongly recommended as very important to the process of all of us becoming more set apart for Yah's purposes, individually and corporately.

We also provide training on many related areas such as boundaries, conflict resolution, trauma resolution, character development, bonding, prayer life development and ministry, personal and corporate spiritual warfare and so forth.

Barbara's professional training as a clinical social worker and as a personal life coach also make it possible to provide individual and group consultations, mentoring and training, formerly through Still Waters, Inc. but now through Christian Transitions at Set Apart Ministries.

Pithy Maxims

Over the years we have been together, we have developed some "sayings" that are very much a part of our identity and the way we encourage one another. A "Pithy Maxim" is a concise statement with profound truth, also called a parable or proverb. 'Short sentences drawn from long experience."

Pray, Stay and Don't Run Away!

Remember, Remember!

His grace is for when we fall short, not when we aim short.

Goals Statement

As we have more fully grown into our vision of an equipping community over these last ten years we have seen the importance of an integrated understanding of how we are to walk out Torah in our lives. The mechanics of exactly how that works together are a work in progress. Through the study of His Word and our ongoing commitment to Him and to one another, we have seen that structure develop and are pleased to share it in the joyful hope that it will be helpful to others who pursue Messiah with every intent to grow up into Him Who alone is our Head.

Beginning from the point of need for personal recovery of those coming out of occult backgrounds we came together and began to develop as a community. Scripture study and discipleship were integral to personal restoration and as we had been studying from a Hebraic viewpoint it also became clear that the traditional Christian lifestyle patterns and practices we ourselves had been in were not free of pagan influences either. We saw that <u>all</u> of us have had painful experiences that have left their mark on our ability to be more like Messiah. Early on we could see that it would be more of an integrated process and less of a "helper-help-ee" professional relationship process, though how much that would be true has been a gradual realization. ...

Messiah Centered Torah Pursuant Relational Maturity Community Model

A number of people have confirmed that what they see among us and how we teach is different from other Hebrew Roots or Messianic ministries. In marketing terms, they call it "branding." It is about providing information unique to your service or product that makes it distinct and distinguishable from all others. It is a task I find ever challenging here as our understanding and my ability to articulate what we learn continues to shift and grow. In our case, "branding" involves our ability to communicate our halacha, the way we walk; what the world would call a model. While many ministries concentrate on teaching what is called "Papa's Torah" our primary focus is on "Mama's Torah." Other terms for it may be spiritual parenting, formation, or mentoring. Our hope is that the pictures of tending to this aspect of our Torah walk and preparation as well as the other will be compelling and desirable for other fellowship groups.

We have two PowerPoint presentations on our site to help provide this distinguishing information about what Messiah is doing in and through us and how it may benefit others. One is rather long, *Be Ye Set Apart*, and the other is intentionally just two minutes, *Prepare*

Messiah's Bride. Both are found on our home page. Our mission statement and goals also provide a window on our Messiah-centric ways. We have many articles that describe various aspects yet it seems there may be another way to approach the matter.

A Torah Pursuant Relational Maturity Community Model.

A phrase that could sound intimidating to some may be enticing to others. What does it mean and why is it distinct? If you have spent any time with us or in reading material on our site you may have already noticed that many topics pertain to relationships as well as to maturity. There is also a model for understanding the various stages that a community or fellowship group is in. We have found this to have great bearing on what approaches can apply to shepherding and decision making in general. Let's look at the four aspects of this phrase.

Torah Pursuant. When studying from a Hebraic perspective to understand the roots of our faith in Messiah Yeshua, one will often see the term, Torah observant, meaning that the people or community referred to are observing the commandments of Scriptures as in the Torah. Strictly speaking "Torah" would be the first five books of the Bible, but is often used as a general term for all of what Christian's have called the "Old Testament." We view it as inclusive of all of His teachings on righteousness. In our case, since most of us did not grow up in a family that observed Torah, we wish to acknowledge that we are aware that we have a great deal to learn and so are pursuing a Torah obedient lifestyle, rather than representing ourselves as "already there."

Relational: it is our understanding that Torah cannot be adequately observed without the context of community and the relationships that exist there. Since our Elohim is Himself, relational, we really couldn't even begin to understand Him as much as we do without also knowing something of the quality of relationships among His people. His ways include recognition of position, family relationships, age, and growing relationship with YHWH. The relationships that reflect Messiah and His Word are very different in quality than those of people with other belief systems or lack of belief. It is in our relationships that the "rubbing" or "bruising" of one another occurs that leads to our sharpening. However, as one well known American Messianic leader put it, sadly, "our iron sharpening iron process can look more like a brawl with lead pipes." Therefore it cannot be simply being in relationship with one another that can adequately encourage and exhort.

Maturity: as you will see in the community definition below, we believe that an understanding of the steps of maturing and appropriate age and stage expectations helps us define the relationships. It also helps us establish who is well enough equipped to offer wise counsel and who is still learning. All too often, people who are still at an earlier stage of maturity than their actual chronological age are trying to or being coerced into providing service that they are not yet equipped to offer. There are many different aspects to maturity from physical to psychological to emotional to spiritual. The overall summary form that we have chosen as a model is "The Life Model TM. " This model has been a basis for both personal and corporate consideration, providing both ideals of maturity stages and how the family or community can help each person grow where needed.

Those who developed the Life Model are Christian Believers but not Torah pursuant, and in fact, in some ways opposed to observance of Torah. This has led them to develop some understandings that, to us, seem to contradict the importance of the Whole Word yet we remain convinced of the basic truths that this model helps us to address as we walk out Torah

together, striving to grow toward maturity in Messiah. The Community Teaching Moments are short pieces in which a particular situation is examined through the eyes of the stages of maturity; putting forth a brief description of what a response from each stage might be. They are meant to provide a "snapshot" of behaviors that will help people apply the facts. They are also intended as conversation starters for groups that want to explore and apply maturity concepts in their fellowship group. Because we are Torah pursuant, some topics are included that wouldn't come up in other venues.

Community: we have developed a description--

A multi-generational group of interdependent, like-minded people with a clear, stable identity based in YHWH, mutually defined and articulated as in a growing organism, with structure, authority, and boundaries; generally based in recognition of attained maturity, and the shared goal of set-apart living in daily interaction; an interdependent network of covenant relationships based in Echad with Messiah Yeshua.

This definition was arrived at through a rather lengthy community wide discussion and analysis of what we understand we are called to do. It remains an ideal and one that I have found needs to be revisited and articulated periodically. It is so easy to fall back into a more worldly idea of how people relate to one another. Most people's church backgrounds did not include so much attention to the quality of all relationships all the time, 24/7, in much the same way that walking out the *moedim*/appointed times/Feasts is more encompassing than the Sunday/Christmas/Easter form of faith expression can be. In fact, because of the comprehensive nature of this model/halacha and its bearing throughout all daily aspects of life, some people get concerned that it is "too much" commitment. There is further discussion of what these topics mean as well as to the four levels of community we have identified here.

So there you have it. An effort to simplify and explain four primary aspects of what we understand it means to be a Set Apart people to our Elohim, a Torah Pursuant Relational Maturity Community *halacha* (the way we walk.)

Study Parameters

We are very clear that Messiah has led us in the choice and timing of the studies we have done over the years, not as a specific blueprint for how it "should be done" but rather as an example. We have made a continuing effort to keep key concepts in mind, including them as we move through additional studies and incorporating what has been learned as we go. We have an entire list of the studies we have covered since our inception in 2000, which is available for review on request.

We also try to use various teaching methods since everyone does not do well with just listening. Some are shy about speaking up but we try to encourage participation from all. So,

we use flashcards, some (friendly) competitive memorization games, Scripture Sword drills on paper or verbal, asking people to act out a particular portion of Scripture or asking them to physically stand and represent a situation, and so forth.

In general, we are very much a participatory study community. We have spent many years building a foundation of teaching members to be able to study well, using appropriate study tools because we have never wanted to be a group that has only a "talking head" though Janell Schroeder is our primary Teaching Elder. Our understanding of Scripture is that each one is to be a "good Berean" (Acts 17:11) and pray and study. Of course, no one has a beautiful gem to share EVERY week, but when we do, we love it!

As far as others coming in to teach, we vet them before we would permit anyone to teach, in person or via media. Our *halachah* (procedures or "the way we walk") is that we do not give any new members big responsibility or authority to anyone until we have walked with them for a year, and gotten to know them. These are factors in stability as we see it.

We prayerfully attempt to focus on what the Scriptures teach, avoiding the errors we see in both traditional Christian/RCC backgrounds and Rabbinic Judaism, trying to stay on the path of righteousness and not fall into either ditch, so to speak!

We do NOT advocate Talmudic or Kabbalistic teaching. We Do affirm that Yeshua haMaschiach is fully YHWH yet fully man, not "just a prophet."

We do not look for personal opinions so much as we go back to the original languages and context to do our best to deal with any questions per Hebraic focus. In fact, we try to avoid just personal opinions, truth be told! Or at least state clearly when it IS just opinion.

After these basic things, there will be many other things along the way, but we can all only learn line by line and precept upon precept, without trying to overwhelm anyone!

Membership vs. Guests

We recognize that there is a difference between those who are interested to join us occasionally or when they are in town and those who want to attend regularly. Local occasional visitors are generally invited to attend on the third Shabbat of each month, and those from out of town, as they contact us.

We do not have any kind of formal, signed membership agreement or requirements other than seeking those who share the same commitment to be set apart to YHWH and to mature to be more like Yeshua. See the **Definition of Community** to help determine if you are in agreement with us. We do have two covenant agreements that are signed and witnessed among us, the long term participants. One pertains to behavior identified as passive aggressive and how we will deal with it and the other is a declaration of our dependence on YHWH's covenant promises as we face spiritual challenges.

We have found that it is really important to establish the degree of interest people have because it is a different matter to work with someone who is just casually interested as compared to someone who is willing to fully enter into the process. It has been clear to us that we need to know the level of interest/commitment because it has an impact on the willingness of each person to receive direction, teaching and shepherding.

So when a person has determined that they do want to become regular members in fellowship with us in SAM, which needs to be confirmed with Barb and Janell, we will try to designate whomever appears to be the best candidate from among our long term members to be a liaison for those inevitable questions.

Shabbat Gathering -Typical Schedule

Some newer people have noted that it might be helpful to include a brief discussion of what our Shabbat gatherings are like. We do believe it is important to meet weekly as a community for Shabbat. We generally gather at about 11 am in order to have time to review any worship dances that are included for the day. At about 11:30 am, we have a time of prayer, we call "prayer on the wall" which came about several years ago as a way to literally stand around our community, and invite YHWH's presence and declaring that our intention is to stand firm as Nehemiah did, building His wall and community. 11:45 is our Shofar Call to Worship. Janell Schroeder is our shofar coordinator and Cheryl Vertz is our dance worship coordinator.

We have an extended time of worship to maintain our Messiah-centric focus and because we find that it takes some time to lay aside the cares of the world and fully enter into His Presence. We have found that we do better with comprehending the Scriptures in our studies when we do the worship time first. Our worship music is from recorded artists as our local members are unable to provide this weekly. We include songs that are consistent with our understanding of the Word, in both Hebrew and English, traditional and contemporary styles. The worship time includes a time of corporate prayer, with weekly leaders chosen by prayerful lot the prior week.

Periodically, we have offered a shorter study and worship opportunity for those who are interested but not yet ready for the full day.

We do not generally have another day of the week for study of the Word so after a brief snack break, usually around 1:30, we begin our studies. (Snacks honor Dietary guidelines and we divide up different types among us so that we don't all bring one thing.) We use some of the traditional prayers of liturgy before and after study, from *The Messianic Siddur*, developed by Torah Resources, which generally concludes about 5 pm. Sometimes, we include a Community Business discussion time as well.

Passover/Feast of Unleavened Bread and Sukkoth

The SAM community has been observing the Biblical Feasts since 2001. We began observing them, generally on just the *Shabbats* and *Shabbatans*(No work days other than the weekly Shabbat). In 2005, we began to observe the entire week of *Sukkoth* (Feast of Tabernacles) together, viewing this as an opportunity to be set apart from the world, to have daily worship and study together and to build our relationships as His community. We now have a rustic site, dedicated for our Sukkoth gatherings. In 2013, we began to observe the entire week of *Pesach* (Passover/Unleavened Bread) together as a community as well. This has been another wonderful "set apart" time to focus on Messiah together as He grows us in community.

Elders

We use this term in several ways. One, for the leadership roles, and the other for the attained level of maturity of each individual. Janell and Barb are both certified Bethel Series teachers, and Advanced Creation Gospel trainers. Janell has also been certified as Precept's teacher with Kay Arthur, and completed 2 1/2 years toward a BA in Messianic studies at a Yeshiva. She has also gotten certification for *Teaching English as a Foreign Language*, which has proven delightful when she is facilitating our Hebrew language classes. I, Barb, teach at times, but am more primarily gifted in shepherding/exhortation/discernment...and seem to be the resident scribe of all that we learn, though I often encourage others to write as well, so that more than just one person's materials are available on our website.

We vet anyone who is permitted to teach in our community, whether in person or other media to maintain clear boundaries in many ways, particularly important to maintain clarity on Yeshua's identity as Fully God and Fully Man; avoiding errors of occult practices, attempting to maintain a straight path on Scriptures, not falling into errors of either traditional Christian teaching or Rabbinic Judaism.

We believe that every community can benefit from as many people in the elder stage of maturity as possible and encourage this personal and spiritual growth among all. The personal growth and maturity aspects of our community are addressed in separate meetings other than on Shabbat, so that we can keep our Messiah focus on this appointed time day. This involves the use of **The Life Model**_T and other materials dealing with maturity, boundaries, conflict management, bonding and trauma resolution.

Prison Outreach

Set Apart Ministries has been a part of the **Brown County Prison Aftercare Network (PAN)** since its founding in 2008. We have helped support 5 men on their release from prison or jail. We participate in monthly meetings of PAN and provide other support as we are able to this group and the Brown County Jail Chaplain. Barb and Bob Klika have provided training to help those about to be released back into the community. Janell Schroeder has been approved to provide a study at the Brown County Jail. We maintain a website page with information relevant to those in prison or family members of someone incarcerated.

Wisconsin Christian Newspaper

We were approached in about 2010 by Rob Pue, Editor of Wisconsin Christian Newspaper, to become a contributor and sponsor to represent the Messianic/Hebrew Roots aspect of faith. Barb writes monthly articles on Bible study and personal maturity matters from a mentorship/coaching perspective for this paper which is distributed freely in stores and restaurants all over Wisconsin, and in 2019 printed copies began to be distributed in many states and now internationally. It is also available online. This is our primary outreach. Since

Rob began provided radio and TV commentaries the reach of this paper, printed and online, has exploded worldwide, praise Yah!

Hebrew Language Class(es)

Janell Schroeder facilitates our ongoing Hebrew language classes twice monthly. Periodically, she offers new classes for those joining us. We use *The Hebrew Primer* and Torah Resources/Tim Hegg's teaching materials.

Financial Records

Set Apart Ministries was incorporated as a 501©3 organization on January 1, 2000, however we have never pursued the ability to offer tax deductible option for donations. We are interested to change status to a "Free Church" status for a number of reasons, though this process is not yet concluded. Barbara and Robert Klika and Janell Schroeder are the incorporating officers. No one receives a salary.

Cheryl Vertz is our volunteer financial coordinator. She keeps track of all income and expenses. There is an in-basket with her name on it at the office for general communications, donations or receipts.

We do not handle money or any financial interactions on Shabbat, but it is acceptable to place any messages, donations in Chery's box after Shabbat gatherings are concluded. We do offer a PayPal option on our website for those who are unable to contribute in person or do not want to mail funds. Please note that there is a percentage deducted when using this option.

SAM also tithes on our income; primarily in support of *Yahweh's Set Apart Ministries* in Kenya, but also several other ministries, as well as local needs such as the Brown County Jail Chaplain.

We maintain an annual sponsorship of Wisconsin Christian Newspaper as an outreach.

Yahweh's Set Apart Ministries-Kenya

We were contacted by Elder Peter Ndungu Warari of Kenya many years ago in his desire to come alongside us for mutual support and encouragement, as well as their need for financial support. Their ministry then registered a parallel name to SAM although we do not have legal ties.

Barb visited Kenya, seeing 8 of then 12 assemblies and there is a video record of that visit. As of 2020, there are 18 assemblies in Kenya and outreaches in Uganda and Tanzania. We hope to visit again soon.

Library

Belinda Dow is our librarian who catalogs resource materials and can help locate what is needed. She has provided an Excel spreadsheet of all materials; that can be accessed on the office laptop to search for placement in shelving.

She is also working to provide a specific listing for all of the materials recommended in our Study Guide/*Bar or Bat Mitzvah* guidelines. Regular attendees and guests are welcome to use our materials, with appropriate information to sign them out and agreement to return them in a timely manner. Some Reference materials are only for use at the office.

A Self-Guided Study-Bar/Bat Mitzvah Guide

Revised May 2020

This guide is found on our website, and reprinted here for your convenience.

It may be used for those who are new to a Hebraic understanding of Scripture, faith and lifestyle as well as for those who would like the honor of obtaining a *Bar or Bat Mitzvah* (A recognized Son/Daughter of the Commandments) with us in our local community. Though such a ceremony is not explicitly commanded in Scripture, it is in a sense a rite of passage, marking the movement from childhood to adulthood, from innocence to moral and spiritual accountability. For those moving toward a Torah pursuant lifestyle in Messiah Yeshua as an adult, it is also a sort of rite of passage. Though there may be a wide knowledge of Scripture as previously taught, there is yet more to be learned as is revealed through the study of Hebrew and a Hebraic context. We find that there is definitely a time of adjustment as all previous beliefs are examined in light of additional information and background.

Traditionally, a *Bar or Bat Mitzvah* occurs around the ages of 12 and 13, which coincides with the arrival of puberty and the awakening within the young person of the fuller meaning of life, responsibility and character. Similar to many cultures this can be seen in traditional Christianity as the time for the rite of Confirmation. Spiritual and moral choices are being made that will establish a direction for the rest of their lives. A wise and discerning parent will recognize this as a crucial time to help a young person set that course wisely.

Those who come to Messiah Yeshua as an adult may have many years within the faith, knowing Him as Jesus of Nazareth and may have gone through such a Confirmation earlier in life. They will see the same Person, the Son of the Living God of Abraham, Isaac and Jacob, but they will be seeing him now more clearly in the context which our YHWH chose. They may well be surprised and struggling with the idea of acceptance of all that is taught from Genesis/Beresheit through Revelation/Hitgalut as being applicable for today; particularly observance of the Feast Days, Shabbat and the dietary guidelines.

Taking the time to establish a firm foundation of understanding is wise. Whether it is during teen years or adult years, this time of transition is intensely important to the stability and fruitfulness of life in Messiah Yeshua and among His people. A Bar or Bat Mitzvah is an honor or status conferred on one who has met the requirements for understanding established by the elders of each Torah pursuant community. When someone of any age has achieved this status, they are viewed by the community as being fully established in covenantal relationship with YHWH Elohim and the community, and are to be viewed by the members with the honor and respect such a status entails.

There will never be one "right" course for all people to develop this foundation, but we have reviewed a great deal of material and have found these listed here to be of great value in that process. These guidelines are comprehensive and attempt to address the knowledge of Torah (both Written and Living Torah) as well as personal, emotional, relational, and spiritual needs for our members to move toward the maturity into Messiah our Head that our community strives to develop.

It just isn't possible to move through this transition quickly, whether adolescent or adult. Understanding comes as the *Ruach*/Spirit leads, line upon line and precept upon precept. We *can* say that we believe a

good working knowledge of the basic stories, people, places and events is necessary first before moving into deeper levels of understanding, as a protective measure against immature interpretation or application. For those adults coming into a Hebraic understanding, you may also find it helpful to read Barb's book: *New to Torah: A Practical Guide to Pursuing Messiah, the Living Word,* for support in dealing with all the changes this transition brings.

We suggest that all students maintain a notebook chronicling all they have done toward establishing their foundation of Scriptural understanding and/or earning their Bar/Bat Mitzvah, including written assignments. This guide may be printed out and used as a check off list for that purpose. We have seen many people study a great deal with various teachers from various sources yet without an established foundation of understanding, these teachings can be easily misconstrued.

If the honor of being a Son or Daughter of the Commandments is desired, this record may then be presented to the Leaders/Elders of the community and witnesses at a Bar/Bat Mitzvah ceremony. They may also choose to ask another member of the community, or a parent, to be confirmed by the leadership, to assist them in maintaining accountability along the way. We do not have formal Bar/Bat Mitzvah classes and do not foresee this in the near future so each candidate will need to be proactive and responsible to document what they have studied.

These guidelines may be modified as determined by the leadership of Set Apart Ministries. Some of them may have been met prior to participation with Set Apart Ministries at the discretion of our leaders yet the honor would not be conferred with less than one year's participation with our community. We affirm that knowledge alone is not sufficient but needs to be clearly shown as part of one's lifestyle, discipline, and relationships, walking it out in love. We are a Zadok ministry more so than an Eli ministry (see *Sons of Zadok* by C.R. Oliver)

May these guidelines prove fruitful in your life as you follow after Messiah, becoming more like Him, as a member of His Set Apart people!

Guidelines for SAM Mentoring

It seems thus far that YHWH has made it clear to us when and who is needed to function as a mentor for our newer people. We are working on guidelines as we go. Thus far, here is our direction.

Mentor

Be available for questions, comments, concerns.

Know when and where to refer for assistance with something with which you are not familiar, rather than guessing.

Be aware of and deflect and address any Drama Triangle patterns of behavior.

Be watchful for any comments, behaviors that seem to indicate discomfort or confusion, and address as soon as possible.

Participant

We are a Torah observant community so we would ask that regular attenders are in the process of observing dietary guidelines and Shabbat and *Moedim*/Appointed Times/Feast Days as they walk with us. We recognize that obedience to Torah--and Messiah Yeshua is BOTH the written and the Living Torah--is our first goal. The secondary concern is recognition of our *halachah*/the way we walk together as a community. We teach both Papa's and Mama's Torah and we encourage participants to be involved in both aspects.

We appreciate your full participation in all of our gatherings, as well as set up and take down--though we try to minimize any "work" on Shabbat--which includes personal preparation for worship and study. We recognize that guests may or may not be involved with the preparations.

When Skyping, we appreciate using the mute button until speaking, and do want to know who is participating online, without "shadow" participants.

When included in our email prayer requests, we ask that you do not forward them to people outside our SAM community. If there is someone you'd like to include, please check with Barb.

Please ask questions of our leaders or your mentor if anything seems confusing! We'd really rather hear and address them than leave someone in confusion!

Please take some time to familiarize yourself with our online website materials if and when you are able.

Please take advantage of our library resource materials and just ask if you need help finding information. Our Study Guide is a helpful resource as one is making the re evaluation of coming into Torah pursuance which we strongly encourage people to check out!
